Hi Everyone,

Some very important news this week so please keep reading.

What you need to know:

- 1. We have received the **2015 NAPLAN results** for students in Grades 3 and 5. These results have been sent out earlier this year in an attempt by the department to make the results more relevant. They will be available for pick up as of **Monday 24 August** and held at the general office for the next two weeks. Could you please make a time to pick up your child's NAPLAN results? The results, while a bit old, do provide some information about your child's progress but should be considered alongside school and other developmental considerations. Some of you will find that the grade 5 NAPLAN results are required by some secondary schools when you come to enrol next year. Please make sure that you put them in a safe place because we do not keep a copy of the results statement at BEPS.

NAPLAN

We all know that the NAPLAN results indicate something about each child and their ability to answer a set of standardised tests, in a set time frame, in a particular week in May. We also know that although we do give the students a look at some typical NAPLAN questions, we do not set aside weeks of learning time to teach-to-the-test. Hence when you look at the NAPLAN results with your child please try to look at them positively. For grade 3 students it is the first time that they have done a test like this. We work hard to get all students to attempt them without stress and anxiety. Sometimes this means that they take their time and don't get the test finished. So what? It takes time and practice to learn the game of doing tests. For the grade 5 students, they have a little more experience, after all it is their second attempt at the NAPLAN tests. I am pleased to say that on the whole the grade 5 students attempted the tests willingly and showed little anxiety. This is a testament to you and the teachers for making them a routine as possible. What is most important as we look at the grade 5 results is that they are making growth and continuing to learn from grade 3 to grade 5. I cannot say this often, or loud, enough; it is not how quickly that we learn – it is that we keep on learning. We have a whole life to do it.

If you have any questions please check with you child's teacher or come along and talk to me, so that we can give more insight into the results.

BEPS Writers festival...


Please remember that the BEPS Writers Festival topic is MATES.

Affixing price stickers and tags and a chance to preview the gifts. Plus a glass of wine for your time.





- Or due to popular demand donate \$6, buys 2 for school and take one home!




Have you had back problems or know someone who does?

Bad habits we learn in childhood can lead to back/neck problems later in life. So we think that it is worthwhile teaching our kids about good habits so that they make good decisions later on. We design our LCs so that they provide a number of different areas for kids to learn in. We provide a variety of ways for kids to learn and they are not sitting at a desk for long periods of time. However, as we move away from work stations and use more mobile technology we are looking to see if we need equipment to improve the ergonomics for students. This is because when using a laptop the percentage of our focal field which we can use for fine focus activities, such as reading, is under 5% of our total visual field. Optimally the top of the screen

should be level with our eye height. If our eyes are not at the correct height, then we might shift our focus by adapting our posture and slump or drop our heads down and forward.

Some of the kids in 4,5,6 have suggested \$2 Lap top risers one possibly and are a hit with some kids!


