Welcome back to term 2!

I sincerely hope that you had time to relax and spend time with family, friends or doing something special.

Term 1 finished with a hive of activity and resulted in BEPS having a new building. We spent some time over the holidays looking at hundreds of different options about how the new building will be used; what principles we would use to decide which students and teachers went into the new building (I received many emotive and persuasive petitions from students at the end of term 1); and finally, who and when students and teachers would go into the portable.

We think that we have plan and we are talking to staff to get their opinion on our decision and make sure that we have made a sound educational decision. Having the new learning area is fantastic and presents us with some exciting opportunities but there is no easy solution as to how students now go into the spaces.

I will take the rest of the week to talk with 123 staff and then inform all staff of our decision next week. I will then run 3 information sessions so that you can come along and find out about our decision – next Wednesday 22 April. We will run one session at 2:30pm, a second session at 5pm and the last session at 7pm. I hope that you can come along and listen to our plans and ask any questions that you might have.

Immunisation Status:

Please make sure that we have your child's current immunisation records. This is of particular concern to me as I know that we have no records for many of our students. Forms were sent out last year and we asked again early this year for families to update records but many people chose not to do so. Parents or guardians must provide an immunisation status certificate to the school regardless of whether the child is or is not immunised. Please note that Homeopathic immunisation is not a recognised form of immunisation, and therefore cannot be listed on an immunisation status certificate.

It is really important, that we have immunisation status certificates for all students to ensure the wellbeing of all students staff and families.

Recently we have had students with Chicken Pox in Alvaera and Il Nido and a couple of cases of head lice. Please if you think that your child may have Chicken Pox please get medical advice as it can be very dangerous to very young and old people.

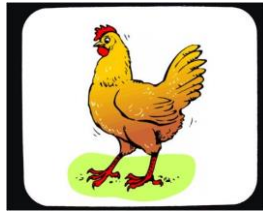
